MY FRIEND JOB

Job really isn't my personal friend. He lived thousands of years ago. Yet, I strongly relate to him. He was a righteous man (far more righteous than I), but he still suffered a staggering amount of trouble in his life. Take note of the horrendous tragedies that befell Job.

First, all of his children were killed in a powerful thunder storm. Not even one survived. Next, he lost all of his wealth. He went from billionaire to dead broke in a few days. Then, a debilitating, painful illness struck him severely. No physician could help. Still further, he lost the respect and honor that his community previously bestowed on him. Even the little children made fun of him. Subsequently, his closest friends accused him of covering up serious sins that caused his troubles. When nothing could get worse, his wife withdrew her affection and support.

In only a few weeks, Job withered in body and spirit to a point that people no longer recognized him. He felt abandoned by God and Man. He fell into a deep depression and wished to die.

It is hard to imagine the magnitude of disasters that befell Job. The severity of his affliction was enough to turn any righteous man from God. But, not Job. He maintained his faith in God and believed that God would restore his life.

I've never had troubles that even approached the extent of those endured by Job. Nevertheless, I think of Job's good example from time to time.

Those who live a Christian life in this world will experience troubles. Problems are sure to come. Jesus said: "*In this world you will have trouble. But, take heart. I have overcome the world*" (Jn. 16:33).

When trouble comes to our lives, let us follow the example of job. May we trust in God and make an honest effort to live for him (faith!). No matter what burdens the world may throw our way, Jesus is our Redeemer. He has already overcome (conquered) the world and its ruler, and he will deliver us from every trial. Deliverance is sure. If not in this life, then when Jesus comes again.
